Winter Programs 2020-2021

WEEKLY WALKS/ACTIVITIES

Led by CMBO's stellar Associate Naturalists and/or staff, these programs meet at locations highlighted on the CMBO Bird and Butterfly Map (available at our stores, or downloadable from our website). Bring binoculars, and dress for prevailing weather and insects according to season. Children accompanied by parents are always welcome (age 15 and younger are free) - walks that are especially *Family-friendly* are noted. Most involve walking a mile or more on varied terrain such as asphalt, boardwalk, gravel, beach, and dirt (sometimes muddy) paths. For more information about accessibility for those with limited mobility, contact the Northwood Center at 609.400.3868. Note: Programs may be cancelled due to difficult/unsafe weather conditions.

PREREGISTRATION IS REQUIRED

To minimize the risk of COVID-19, NJ Audubon is implementing the following safety protocols:

- 1) In-person programs will be limited in group size, and as such, each person must preregister for each program they would like to attend. Drop-ins will be turned away.

- 3) Unfortunately, we will not be sharing any optics so please bring your own equipment.
- 4) Leaders and participants must wear face coverings throughout the program and maintain social distancing (at least 6' of separation). Leaders may remove their face covering in order to be heard by the group while maintaining social distance.

New Jersey Audubon field trips and programs adhere to CDC guidelines; leaders have the right to ask a participant to leave the program if someone is not adhering to these guidelines for the health and safety of all. 1) BIRDING CAPE MAY POINT Saturdays. December 5 to February 27 **EXCEPT December 19 and 26** 8:00 AM - 10:00 AM

Meets near the Hawkwatch Platform at Cape May Point State Park. Enjoy wintering ducks, swans, sparrows, and other songbirds. Preregistration required.

Cost: \$6 members. \$10 nonmembers.

2 GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT Saturday, February 13 10:00 AM - 3:00 PM At CMBO's Northwood Center. FREE hourly walks.

3 SUNSET BEACH: A Place For All Seasons **Sundays: December 13, January 3, February 7**

9:00 AM - 11:00 AM

Meets at the parking lot behind the miniature golf course, on the north side of Sunset Blvd as you approach Sunset Beach. Part of the Higbee Beach WMA, the Sunset Beach area hosts an array of birds, including sparrows, warblers, hawks, and waterbirds. This FREE walk is sponsored by the NJ Division of Fish and Wildlife. Preregistration required.

4 SUNDAY MORNING AT TURKEY POINT

Sundays, February 14 to 28 8:00 AM - 10:00 AM

Meets at the end of Turkey Point Road in Cumberland County (reached from Route 553 south of the town of Dividing Creek) in the Natural Lands Glades Wildlife Refuge. Walk New Jersey's miracle mile for winter birds. *Preregistration required*. Cost: \$6 members, \$10 nonmembers.

3 NIGHTFALL AT JAKES LANDING

Sunday, February 28 4:30 PM to DUSK

Meets at the end of Jakes Landing Road, near Dennisville, off of Route 47. Watch for Northern Harriers, Short-eared Owls, Great Horned Owls, and winter songbirds where the forest meets the salt marsh. *Preregistration required*. Cost: \$6 members. \$10 nonmembers.

6 BIRDING THE MEADOWS • Mondays, December 7 to February 22 EXCEPT December 21 & 28; January 18; and February 15 8:00 AM - 10:00 AM

Meets at The Nature Conservancy's South Cape May Meadows Preserve parking lot on Sunset Blvd. You can expect waterfowl, sparrows, gulls, raptors, and other songbirds. *Preregistration required*.

7 HARLEQUIN ROMANCE

Saturday, December 12 10:00 AM - 4:00 PM

With Program Director Melissa Roach and CMBO naturalists. Harlequin Ducks and Purple Sandpipers are almost guaranteed on this trip to Barnegat Light State Park along with scoters, gulls, Northern Gannets and other winter specialties. This trip involves a long walk over sand and jetty, is often windy and cold, but always productive. *Preregistration required*.

Cost: \$24 members, \$32 nonmembers.

® KICK OFF YOUR YEAR LIST IN CAPE MAY Friday, January 1 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM

With Director Brett Ewald and CMBO Naturalists. Meets near the Hawkwatch Platform at Cape May Point State Park. Every bird is new today! Recent years have produced over 70 species, including many seasonal highlights and rarities. We'll visit multiple locations and hotspots, breaking for an hour or so for lunch and to warm up. *Preregistration required*.

Cost: \$24 members, \$32 nonmembers.

1:00 PM - 4:00 PM

With Chris Marks and CMBO Naturalists. Meets at the Cape May National Wildlife Refuge's Two Mile Beach Unit. We'll see shorebirds, gulls, and waterfowl as we walk the beach to the Cold Spring Jetty where we'll look for Great Cormorant and Purple Sandpiper. *Preregistration required*. Cost: \$15 members, \$20 nonmembers.

10 BRIGANTINE AND MOTT'S CREEK

Sunday, January 24 1:30 PM - 5:30 PM

With Janet Crawford and CMBO Naturalists. Edwin B. Forsythe NWR is a great place to see waterfowl, Northern Harriers, Short-eared Owls, eagles and Rough-legged Hawks. After birding the refuge, the group will head to nearby Mott's Creek for raptor watching. A refuge pass (\$4; can be purchased that day), Golden Age Pass, or federal duck stamp will be required for each vehicle to enter the NWR. *Preregistration required*.

111 LONGTAILS IN LOVE

Saturday, February 13 10:00 AM - 4:00 PM

With Chuck Slugg and CMBO Naturalists. Meets at the 8th Street and Avalon Avenue intersection in Avalon. Long-tailed Ducks court during the weeks surrounding Valentine's Day, with the males yodeling melodically to their mates. We'll also search for Long-tailed Ducks and other waterfowl in the ocean, bays, inlets and ponds from Avalon to Cape May Harbor. *Preregistration required*. Cost: \$24 members, \$32 nonmembers.

13 POOR MAN'S PELAGIC

Saturday, March 20 12:30 PM - 4:30 PM

With Program Director Melissa Roach and CMBO Naturalists. Meets at the Cape May Ferry for a half hour of birding from the landing before traveling across the Delaware Bay aboard the Cape May-Lewes Ferry at 1pm and return on the 2:45 boat. Expect to see Northern Gannets, loons, cormorants, gulls, terns, and scoters in the bay. PHOTO I.D. 15 THE BEST OF WINTER BIRDING - EAGLES, OWLS, DUCKS & MORE! · Saturday-Sunday, January 16-17

With CMBO Director Brett Ewald, Southern NJ provides incredible winter birding! With over ten species of diurnal raptors (hawks and owls) and twenty-five species of waterfowl possible, there is so much to see and appreciate, set in some of the most beautiful and remote landscapes on the Eastern Seaboard. While we'll focus on these groups of birds, we'll also take time to enjoy shorebirds, gulls, gannets, sparrows are more on this in-the-field workshop. Past years have featured Rough-legged Hawks, Short-eared Owls, and eiders. Preregistration required.

Cost: \$150 members, \$200 nonmembers.

® TECHNIQUES OF FIELD OBSERVATION Saturday, February 20

With Michael O'Brien. Sharpen your field skills in the workshop that every birder wishes they'd taken. Binoculars show you the bird; field guides identify the bird. But how many times have you studied a bird, only to discover that all the information you gathered has evaporated by the time you get to the field guide or you failed to note the most distinguishable field mark? This workshop will teach you how to look, record, and recall like an expert. Preregistration required.
